The Board of Evangelism and Social Calling Eccused on the kind of society we must create in the

Focused on the kind of society we must create in this country if men and women are to to be faithful to God and good to each other and to their children. For example, one remarkable report on family life in 1936 pointed out that frequent childbearing was a source of poverty and stress in family life. The Board called on the government to establish clinics "to advise married couples on methods of controlling the frequency of child-birth." The statement is remarkable in many respects. It was adopted by an all-male Board, which did not stoop to the customary platitudes about women and the glorious calling of child-birth. Instead, these people linked poverty and childbearing at a time when giving information on family planning to poor people was a criminal offence. What's more, it would be another 33 years before the distribution of birth control devices would become legal in Canada.

In this report of the church, as in many others, there is an unavoidable theme: human life is valuable. God has demonstrated this in the incarnation. People deserve human dignity. People are created equal, including men and women. This perspective has led the people of the church in communities across the country to put enegy into building organizations that enhance human dignity.
