The Panel for Intersection of Faith, Advocacy and Public life was inspiring to all who attended – and if you missed it, the event was recorded and can be found on Westminster's Facebook page (date Oct 23). Our panelists were Rev. Mark Wartman (clergy and politician), Rev. Bonnie Morton (advocate and clergy) and Rev. Peter Gilmer (Regina Anti-Poverty Ministry). The United Church has been active in the public arena since its earliest days and we continue to live out our faith in many ways of Daring Justice. We have been bold in areas of anti-racism, disabilities, economic justice, environmental, gender and sexuality, human rights, indigenous justice and many more.

An example of what we heard - Being involved with the people experiencing homelessness, or people with a disability facing a lack of funds and infrastructure, etc. helps in identifying the true needs, rather than perceived needs. The example was given of concerned outsiders believing the immediate need is housing, whereas people experiencing homelessness felt access to bathrooms was a more immediate need.

"You have a voice, use it – politicians listen".

"Political action does not end by placing your x on a ballot – it should start there". "Push me as a politician, so I am informed on the topic"

Peter cited many examples within our provincial social services where faith based organizations have made a difference.

What are the challenges for today and the future – the right-wing Christianity threatens advancements in social justices.
