
Stewardship Second:

Stewardship Task Group

Stewardship, sharing, and generosity are key spiritual practices for followers of Jesus that are at the heart of all our relationships as we strive to love God and love our neighbours, using all we have. The practice of giving focuses our attention on the needs of others and on our gratitude for the abundance we have. Like all spiritual



practices, regularly sharing the resources we have at our disposal will change us over time. Our ideas of abundance will grow, our understanding of value will be transformed, and we

will become more thankful and in turn more generous with what we have. The task team will promote the stewardship of gifts the congregation has and provide a program once year where people will intentionally look at what they can offer the community of faith.

Justice and Reconciliation Task Team

– This team grew out of the healing garden initiative and focuses on education, advocacy, and relationship building around Indigenous culture, the legacy of residential schools, and reconciliation. The healing garden remains central to its work, supported by a dedicated sub-team with community and Indigenous representation. The team meets quarterly and organizes educational and cultural events in collaboration with Indigenous and community partners such as educational film viewings, Indigenous led Sunday services, Indigenous craft shows, cultural workshops, and educational activities at the healing garden. Their first community event of the year is a short film screening and discussion series on Reserve 107: Reconciliation on the Prairies.
April 9 (6:30pm-8pm) -Reserve 107: Reconciliation on the Prairies (2016) film viewing and discussion
April 13 (6:30pm-8pm) - Reserve 107A: A Path Forward (2025) film viewing and discussion
These films tell the story of the Young Chippewyan Band and their Mennonite and Lutheran neighbours, as they walk together on a journey of reconciliation at Laird Saskatchewan.
